

## The number of children of immigrants in NC has increased by 36% from 2010-2021


Number of children of immigrants in the U.S. vs. NC over time


### 19.8% of children in NC have at least one foreign-born parent % of children with at least one foreign-born parent by state, 2021


### Wake and Mecklenburg counties have the largest numbers of children of immigrants



### Most children of immigrants in NC have at least one noncitizen parent

% of children of immigrants in NC by child's and parents citizenship, 2021



Note: Only reported when data on child and parent are not missing. All children have at least one foreign-born parent. Regardless of parent(s) status, all children who are noncitizens are classified as noncitizen children. In single parent families, citizen children are classified based on the status of the status of their parent. In two parent families, citizen children are first classified as citizen children with a U.S.-born parent when one parent is U.S. born and then classified as citizen children with a naturalized parent when at least one parent is naturalized. Finally, if both parents are noncitizens then children are classified as citizen children with noncitizen parents.

Top 10 parents' birth countries among children of immigrants in NC, 2021




Race/ethnicity of children of immigrants in NC, 2021


### Most children (age 5+) of immigrants speak English only, or are bilingual and Speak English well or very well

Parents English fluency among children of immigrants in NC, 2021



Non-English Languages spoken at home among children of immigrants in NC, 2021



## Most children of immigrants in NC are elementary school ages, between 5 and 12 years old


Age distribution of children of immigrants in NC, 2021

## The educational attainment of foreign-born parents varies substantially by race/ethnicity


Educational attainment of parents among children of immigrants in NC by child's race/ethnicity, 2021

Employment of parents of children of immigrants in NC by child's race/ethnicity, 2021



Internet access of households with children of immigrants in NC by child's race/ethnicity, 2021



# Income, Food, and Health Security

#### **Eligibility for Public Assistance**


- Eligibility for public assistance varies for cash assistance (TANF/Work First), food assistance (SNAP), and medical assistance (Medicaid/CHIP).
- Income eligibility is least generous for cash assistance (~33% FPL) and most generous for food (130%-200% FPL) and medical assistance (Max 215% FPL for children).
- Eligibility depends primarily on a person's age, family federal poverty level, disability status, and legal residency status.
- Like all other children who are U.S. citizens, citizen children in immigrant families are eligible for public assistance programs

### Noncitizens' Eligibility for Public Assistance in NC

- Few noncitizens are eligible for public assistance. Eligible noncitizens include:
  - Refugees and asylees
  - ✓ Legal Permanent Residents (LPRs) who immigrated to the U.S. prior to 1996.
  - ✓ LPRs who have live in the U.S. for more than 5 years and immigrated to the U.S. after 1996.
  - Pregnant women and children under 19, who are "lawfully present" or "qualified aliens" regardless of years in the U.S. (Medicaid Only)

### Low-income children of immigrants have limited access to cash assistance



% of low-income (<200% FPL) NC children of immigrants in households receiving SNAP benefits by child's race/ethnicity and parents' citizenship, 2021


