

Jackson County: Census 2020 Real-Time Response Rates - Week Ending May 17

How is Jackson County performing?

26.7% of households in Jackson County have self-responded to the 2020 Census between March 12 and May 17, 2020, **below** the state response rate of **55.7%**. Jackson County is currently ranked 97 out of 100 counties in NC.

How are people responding to the 2020 Census in Jackson County?

20.3% of Jackson households responded to the census online versus 44.1% of all NC households.

6.4% of Jackson households responded to the census by phone or mail versus 11.6% of all NC households.
