

Duplin County: Census 2020 Real-Time Response Rates – Week Ending March 29

How is Duplin County performing?

24.4% of households in Duplin County have self-responded to the 2020 Census between March 12 and March 29, 2020, **below** the state response rate of **30.0%**. Duplin County is currently ranked 80 out of 100 counties in NC.

How are people responding to the 2020 Census in Duplin County?

8.9% of Duplin households responded to the census online versus 25.3% of all NC households.

15.5% of Duplin households responded to the census by phone or mail versus 4.7% of all NC households.
